### A BRIEF HISTORY

The name 'Ewhurst' derives from the Old English 'hyrst', meaning 'wooded-hill', and 'iw' meaning 'yew tree', first recorded in 1179. A Roman road runs almost the full length of the parish and a villa was discovered at Rapsley in 1956. Ewhurst is not named in the Domesday Book but was part of the Royal Manor of Gomshall. The church is first recorded in 1140.

From the 14th century, houses and personal names were recorded in taxation records and are associated with surviving place names among them Johannes Wekehurst [Wykehurst], Henricus Byldener [Bildens], Alicia Coverworth [Coverwood], Walterus Garlond [Garlands], Ricardus Godebrug [Gadbridge]. The oldest surviving houses date from the early 1400s, including White Hart House, Hoyle Cottage, Coverwood Farm, and Oak Cottage, Ellen's Green.

The parish was not affected by the 18th century enclosures but there was much poverty with poaching and smuggling rife. Ewhurst Mill and The Windmill Inn are reputed to have been smugglers' haunts. The heavy clay and poor roads contributed to the isolation. William Cobbett, author of 'Rural Rides', noted in 1823 that at Ewhurst he found "the deepest clay that I ever saw".

Ewhurst remained small and isolated until the late 19th century, when improved communications and a growing appreciation of the beauty of the wild Surrey countryside encouraged many wealthy businessmen and artistic people to move into the area. They commissioned top architects to design their new homes, giving the parish a wealth of Arts & Crafts houses. Ewhurst School was established in 1846 and a second school was opened in Ellen's Green in 1870 (closed 1948).

The War Memorial bears witness to the Ewhurst men who died in the First World War. The recreation ground was laid out as a living memorial to those who died in the Second World War. Sayers Croft Camp was built in 1942 for London evacuees. The coronation of Elizabeth II was marked with the erection of the village sign, incorporating the Royal Insignia and the date 1953.

### The Parish of Ewhurst and Ellens Green Today

The village of Ewhurst and the nearby hamlet of Ellens Green sit just below the beautiful Surrey Hills. Ewhurst village is 2 miles east of Cranleigh on the B2127 and is the more populated part of the parish. It enjoys reasonably good amenities for a rural village and many active local organisations, which foster a strong community feeling. The total population of the whole parish is just under 2,500.

It is close to the heart of the Surrey Hills Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty, with plenty of footpaths and bridleways to enjoy as well as an abundance of common land:

- The Downs Link runs along the disused Guildford to Horsham railway line and is available for walkers, cyclists and horses.
- Pitch Hill and the Hurtwood, to the north of Ewhurst village, are popular with dog walkers, riders, joggers and off-road cyclists.
- By-roads in the area occasionally cater for cycling events.
- The National Trust's Winkworth Arboretum is a few miles to the West.

Ewhurst village has a thriving shop, Hazelbank Country Stores, offering a wide range of provisions and facilities. The village pub, The Bulls Head Inn, is an important part of village life and also offers accommodation.

Ewhurst's lovely church building has stood on the hill in the centre of the village for over 850 years. It is an integral part of village life and was voted the most important community asset after the village pub. At least one service is held every Sunday as well as services to mark special Christian and national festivals.

The church is open every day and both the village school and pre-school have services and visits to the church. It is regularly visited by the children staying at Sayers Croft Rural Centre and members of local History and Bell Ringing societies. This is due to both the age of the church and its special bells which - unusually for such a small village church - have a full peal of eight.



The Wilson Room, in the churchyard is the church community room, used for social gatherings and after-service coffees. The village hall, in the care of the Parish Council is used by a wide range of organisations for many different activities. The Recreation Ground is well maintained with football and rugby pitches plus hard standing tennis courts, a sports pavilion and magnificent,

recently refurbished children's play area

Ellens Green Memorial Hall is used by a variety of organisations and also has a children's playground.



Ewhurst village is very community minded with a range of clubs and societies which join together every two years for the village carnival.

In the heart of the village is Sayers Croft Rural Centre, owned by Westminster Council.The Centre offers on-site outdoor activities for visiting school groups as well as

local children.. In 2009 Ewhurst was proud to win the Surrey Community Village of the Year.

Schooling within the parish is provided by Ewhurst CofE Infants School and Rainbows End preschool. There are also two independent schools -The Duke of Kent and Hurtwood House.

Property in the parish is largely privately owned. There is some social housing in The Glebe - for the elderly, the disabled and those with links to the village - where the Glebe Centre community hall. is also located.

Although some people are employed locally, a significant number commute to London from here. The local planning authority is under pressure to approve substantial housing development in the area and Ewhurst has seen a number of recent new developments that are now part of the village.

Most businesses and shops are in the larger village of Cranleigh. This has supermarkets, a high street with independent shops, a main post office, Health Centre, dentists, Library, petrol station and Leisure Centre There are also a number of places to eat out and a popular weekly market.

Ellens Green is closer to Rudgwick village which provides their basic needs - including a medical and dental centre, a pharmacy, Coop store cum post office plus other independent businesses and a garage at Bucks Green.

### **Public Transport**

Ewhurst and Ellens Green are not particularly well served by public transport. There is an hourly bus service from Ewhurst to Cranleigh and Guildford. Cranleigh offers more frequent bus services to more places.

The nearest train stations are at Gomshall (5.6 miles), Shalford (9.4 miles) Dorking (9.5 miles) Horsham (10.4 miles) and Guildford (10.6 miles).

Ewhurst History Society welcomes anyone with an interest in history, especially local history.

Lecture meetings, presented by local and visiting speakers, are held from September to May, on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Tuesday of the month at the EYSC building on the Recreation Ground. Members enjoy outings to places of interest plus winter and summer social events. We publish an on-line Journal, with articles by members on a wide variety of subjects relating to local and social history.

The Society has built up a considerable archive of information on the history of the parish, including old photographs, maps and documents; transcripts of censuses, parish registers, tithes, etc.; and extensive notes on individual houses and biographies of Ewhurst people. 

### EWHURST BOWLS CLUB

### Bell Ringing at St Peter & St Paul Ewhurst

The sound of church bells ringing is a unique part of the British countryside. The art of bell ringing, as we know it today, has developed from the fourteenth century. In our church we have eight bells. Two of these have a foundry marks that shows they were cast around 1450. The main purpose for ringing the bells is for Sunday services and other major festivals. They are also rung for weddings and national or local events.

Bell ringing is open to anyone in reasonable health. It requires skill rather than strength so people of all ages can learn. Children need to beat least ten years of age although height rather than age is the important factor. Beginners learn to control the bell with the rope and then ring in time with others (rounds) before trying set patterns (call charges and method ringing).



New ringers always have help to start ringing and the bell can be "tied" or silenced so that they can learn control without disturbing the neighbours!

Ringing practice is on Wednesdays from 7.30 – 9.00 pm. If you train to be a bell ringer, we would hope that you would be available to ring on a fairly regular basis, but any ringing you could do, would be welcome.

We set up the FSPSP charity in 2021 to align Ewhurst church with arrangements for the other two churches in the Parish of Ewhurst with Okewood and Forest Green (EOFG)

FSPSP is independent of the parish (EOFG) and raises money for the restoration of Ewhurst's historic village church, St Peter & St Paul. We also inform people about the history of this lovely building which is on Historic England's "At Risk" register.

The Church has been at the heart of the village since 1190. We want it to be there for future generations to use and to be a quiet place for people to remember the past and look to the future.

You can easily get involved with FSPSP by taking part in our fundraising events — either to support us or to help organise. There are plenty of different jobs to do, and how much you do is up to you!

We do need money for urgent major repairs as we get NO help from the Church of England or from Local or National Government. # Ewhurst Premises

The Parish Council manages three halls in Ewhurst which are all available for hire.

### The Village Hall GU6 7PX

The Village Hall is located on The Street in Ewhurst. The main hall is available for hire during the day in school holidays, otherwise for evenings and weekends all year round. The hall has a maximum capacity of 100. Chairs, tables, crockery, glasses and cutlery are for hirers' use. Facilities include a fully fitted kitchen, a serving area with a sink, facilities for the disabled and WiFi. The village car park opposite has plenty of parking, but space outside the hall for the disabled is limited.

### The EYSC GU6 7RB

The EYSC is situated on the recreation ground at the end of Broomers Lane. The front entrance leads to a lobby with a lift and stairs leading to the first floor main hall which is for hire during the day and evenings, and at weekends. The hall has a maximum capacity of 60. Facilities include a fully fitted kitchen, WiFi, facilities for the disabled and a wall-mounted projector screen. There is a large car park area to the side of the EYSC and the recreation ground and its facilities are adjacent. They include a large children's play area, tennis courts and a basketball area.

### The Glebe Centre GU6 7PZ

The newly refurbished Glebe Centre is in the centre of The Glebe, to the North of the church. The main room has capacity for 50 people. There is a large and well-equipped kitchen, toilets for the disabled and a small grassed area outside. Parking is very limited.
